

Alabama: District 5

The Need for Services

- 30,940 women in need of publicly supported contraceptive services and supplies live in Alabama's 5th congressional district.

Meeting the Need

- There are 19 family planning clinics in Alabama's 5th congressional district. 7 are run by health departments, 0 are run by hospitals, 1 is run by Planned Parenthood, 11 are run by community health centers and 0 are run by other types of agencies.
- Together, these clinics serve 12,830 women, including 4,080 teenagers.* 86% are served by health departments, 0% are served by hospitals, 6% are served by Planned Parenthood, 8% are served by community health centers and 0% are served by other types of agencies.

The Key Role of Title X

- 7 of the family planning clinics in Alabama's 5th congressional district are supported by Title X. 7 are run by health departments, 0 are run by hospitals, 0 are run by Planned Parenthood, 0 are run by community health centers and 0 are served by other types of agencies.
- These Title X-supported clinics in Alabama's 5th congressional district serve 11,010 women, including 3,620 teenagers.* 100% are served by health departments, 0% are served by hospitals, 0% are served by Planned Parenthood, 0% are served by community health centers and 0% are served by other types of agencies.

** These women may or may not live in 5th congressional district.*
