

Alabama: District 7

The Need for Services

- 62,430 women in need of publicly supported contraceptive services and supplies live in Alabama's 7th congressional district.

Meeting the Need

- There are 31 family planning clinics in Alabama's 7th congressional district. 18 are run by health departments, 2 are run by hospitals, 0 are run by Planned Parenthood, 10 are run by community health centers and 1 is run by an other type of agency.
- Together, these clinics serve 26,730 women, including 7,750 teenagers.* 81% are served by health departments, 8% are served by hospitals, 0% are served by Planned Parenthood, 7% are served by community health centers and 4% are served by other types of agencies.

The Key Role of Title X

- 18 of the family planning clinics in Alabama's 7th congressional district are supported by Title X. 18 are run by health departments, 0 are run by hospitals, 0 are run by Planned Parenthood, 0 are run by community health centers and 0 are served by other types of agencies.
- These Title X-supported clinics in Alabama's 7th congressional district serve 21,600 women, including 6,190 teenagers.* 100% are served by health departments, 0% are served by hospitals, 0% are served by Planned Parenthood, 0% are served by community health centers and 0% are served by other types of agencies.

** These women may or may not live in 7th congressional district.*
