

Colorado: District 7

The Need for Services

- 29,980 women in need of publicly supported contraceptive services and supplies live in Colorado's 7th congressional district.

Meeting the Need

- There are 12 family planning clinics in Colorado's 7th congressional district. 3 are run by health departments, 1 is run by a hospital, 3 are run by Planned Parenthood, 5 are run by community health centers and 0 are run by other types of agencies.
- Together, these clinics serve 23,890 women, including 5,360 teenagers.* 15% are served by health departments, 3% are served by hospitals, 65% are served by Planned Parenthood, 17% are served by community health centers and 0% are served by other types of agencies.

The Key Role of Title X

- 3 of the family planning clinics in Colorado's 7th congressional district are supported by Title X. 3 are run by health departments, 0 are run by hospitals, 0 are run by Planned Parenthood, 0 are run by community health centers and 0 are served by other types of agencies.
- These Title X-supported clinics in Colorado's 7th congressional district serve 3,550 women, including 990 teenagers.* 100% are served by health departments, 0% are served by hospitals, 0% are served by Planned Parenthood, 0% are served by community health centers and 0% are served by other types of agencies.

** These women may or may not live in 7th congressional district.*
