

Connecticut: District 5

The Need for Services

- 30,600 women in need of publicly supported contraceptive services and supplies live in Connecticut's 5th congressional district.

Meeting the Need

- There are 8 family planning clinics in Connecticut's 5th congressional district. 0 are run by health departments, 2 are run by hospitals, 3 are run by Planned Parenthood, 3 are run by community health centers and 0 are run by other types of agencies.
- Together, these clinics serve 10,820 women, including 3,930 teenagers.* 0% are served by health departments, 16% are served by hospitals, 75% are served by Planned Parenthood, 9% are served by community health centers and 0% are served by other types of agencies.

The Key Role of Title X

- 4 of the family planning clinics in Connecticut's 5th congressional district are supported by Title X. 0 are run by health departments, 1 is run by a hospital, 3 are run by Planned Parenthood, 0 are run by community health centers and 0 are served by other types of agencies.
- These Title X-supported clinics in Connecticut's 5th congressional district serve 9,600 women, including 3,730 teenagers.* 0% are served by health departments, 15% are served by hospitals, 85% are served by Planned Parenthood, 0% are served by community health centers and 0% are served by other types of agencies.

** These women may or may not live in 5th congressional district.*
