

## District of Columbia: at-large

### The Need for Services

- 41,260 women in need of publicly supported contraceptive services and supplies live in the District of Columbia's at-large congressional district.

### Meeting the Need

- There are 26 family planning clinics in the District of Columbia's at-large congressional district. 0 are run by health departments, 6 are run by hospitals, 2 are run by Planned Parenthood, 12 are run by community health centers and 6 are run by other types of agencies.
- Together, these clinics serve 19,140 women, including 4,670 teenagers.\* 0% are served by health departments, 24% are served by hospitals, 30% are served by Planned Parenthood, 22% are served by community health centers and 24% are served by other types of agencies.

### The Key Role of Title X

- 17 of the family planning clinics in the District of Columbia's at-large congressional district are supported by Title X. 0 are run by health departments, 4 are run by hospitals, 2 are run by Planned Parenthood, 8 are run by community health centers and 3 are served by other types of agencies.
- These Title X-supported clinics in the District of Columbia's at-large congressional district serve 14,390 women, including 3,270 teenagers.\* 0% are served by health departments, 17% are served by hospitals, 40% are served by Planned Parenthood, 19% are served by community health centers and 23% are served by other types of agencies.

*\* These women may or may not live in at-large congressional district.*
