

Georgia: District 5

The Need for Services

- 56,780 women in need of publicly supported contraceptive services and supplies live in Georgia's 5th congressional district.

Meeting the Need

- There are 30 family planning clinics in Georgia's 5th congressional district. 19 are run by health departments, 2 are run by hospitals, 1 is run by Planned Parenthood, 7 are run by community health centers and 1 is run by an other type of agency.
- Together, these clinics serve 29,570 women, including 8,220 teenagers.* 28% are served by health departments, 40% are served by hospitals, 20% are served by Planned Parenthood, 10% are served by community health centers and 2% are served by other types of agencies.

The Key Role of Title X

- 21 of the family planning clinics in Georgia's 5th congressional district are supported by Title X. 19 are run by health departments, 1 is run by a hospital, 1 is run by Planned Parenthood, 0 are run by community health centers and 0 are served by other types of agencies.
- These Title X-supported clinics in Georgia's 5th congressional district serve 25,500 women, including 7,030 teenagers.* 33% are served by health departments, 44% are served by hospitals, 23% are served by Planned Parenthood, 0% are served by community health centers and 0% are served by other types of agencies.

** These women may or may not live in 5th congressional district.*
