

Kentucky: District 5

The Need for Services

- 67,740 women in need of publicly supported contraceptive services and supplies live in Kentucky's 5th congressional district.

Meeting the Need

- There are 53 family planning clinics in Kentucky's 5th congressional district. 41 are run by health departments, 2 are run by hospitals, 0 are run by Planned Parenthood, 10 are run by community health centers and 0 are run by other types of agencies.
- Together, these clinics serve 32,140 women, including 9,370 teenagers.* 86% are served by health departments, 4% are served by hospitals, 0% are served by Planned Parenthood, 11% are served by community health centers and 0% are served by other types of agencies.

The Key Role of Title X

- 39 of the family planning clinics in Kentucky's 5th congressional district are supported by Title X. 39 are run by health departments, 0 are run by hospitals, 0 are run by Planned Parenthood, 0 are run by community health centers and 0 are served by other types of agencies.
- These Title X-supported clinics in Kentucky's 5th congressional district serve 27,370 women, including 7,890 teenagers.* 100% are served by health departments, 0% are served by hospitals, 0% are served by Planned Parenthood, 0% are served by community health centers and 0% are served by other types of agencies.

** These women may or may not live in 5th congressional district.*
