



Massachusetts: District 1

The Need for Services

- 37,650 women in need of publicly supported contraceptive services and supplies live in Massachusetts's 1st congressional district.

Meeting the Need

- There are 13 family planning clinics in Massachusetts's 1st congressional district. 0 are run by health departments, 0 are run by hospitals, 0 are run by Planned Parenthood, 4 are run by community health centers and 9 are run by other types of agencies.
- Together, these clinics serve 8,990 women, including 3,320 teenagers.* 0% are served by health departments, 0% are served by hospitals, 0% are served by Planned Parenthood, 19% are served by community health centers and 81% are served by other types of agencies.

The Key Role of Title X

- 9 of the family planning clinics in Massachusetts's 1st congressional district are supported by Title X. 0 are run by health departments, 0 are run by hospitals, 0 are run by Planned Parenthood, 0 are run by community health centers and 9 are served by other types of agencies.
- These Title X-supported clinics in Massachusetts's 1st congressional district serve 7,330 women, including 3,040 teenagers.* 0% are served by health departments, 0% are served by hospitals, 0% are served by Planned Parenthood, 0% are served by community health centers and 100% are served by other types of agencies.

** These women may or may not live in 1st congressional district.*
