

Massachusetts: District 5

The Need for Services

- 31,880 women in need of publicly supported contraceptive services and supplies live in Massachusetts's 5th congressional district.

Meeting the Need

- There are 4 family planning clinics in Massachusetts's 5th congressional district. 0 are run by health departments, 1 is run by a hospital, 0 are run by Planned Parenthood, 2 are run by community health centers and 1 is run by an other type of agency.
- Together, these clinics serve 4,940 women, including 1,560 teenagers.* 0% are served by health departments, 6% are served by hospitals, 0% are served by Planned Parenthood, 64% are served by community health centers and 30% are served by other types of agencies.

The Key Role of Title X

- 3 of the family planning clinics in Massachusetts's 5th congressional district are supported by Title X. 0 are run by health departments, 0 are run by hospitals, 0 are run by Planned Parenthood, 2 are run by community health centers and 1 is served by an other type of agency.
- These Title X-supported clinics in Massachusetts's 5th congressional district serve 4,660 women, including 1,470 teenagers.* 0% are served by health departments, 0% are served by hospitals, 0% are served by Planned Parenthood, 68% are served by community health centers and 32% are served by other types of agencies.

** These women may or may not live in 5th congressional district.*
