

Massachusetts: District 7

The Need for Services

- 22,690 women in need of publicly supported contraceptive services and supplies live in Massachusetts's 7th congressional district.

Meeting the Need

- There are 10 family planning clinics in Massachusetts's 7th congressional district. 0 are run by health departments, 3 are run by hospitals, 0 are run by Planned Parenthood, 0 are run by community health centers and 7 are run by other types of agencies.
- Together, these clinics serve 18,290 women, including 1,580 teenagers.* 0% are served by health departments, 16% are served by hospitals, 0% are served by Planned Parenthood, 0% are served by community health centers and 84% are served by other types of agencies.

The Key Role of Title X

- 2 of the family planning clinics in Massachusetts's 7th congressional district are supported by Title X. 0 are run by health departments, 1 is run by a hospital, 0 are run by Planned Parenthood, 0 are run by community health centers and 1 is served by an other type of agency.
- These Title X-supported clinics in Massachusetts's 7th congressional district serve 1,610 women, including 680 teenagers.* 0% are served by health departments, 9% are served by hospitals, 0% are served by Planned Parenthood, 0% are served by community health centers and 91% are served by other types of agencies.

** These women may or may not live in 7th congressional district.*
