

Massachusetts: District 8

The Need for Services

- 77,340 women in need of publicly supported contraceptive services and supplies live in Massachusetts's 8th congressional district.

Meeting the Need

- There are 40 family planning clinics in Massachusetts's 8th congressional district. 0 are run by health departments, 9 are run by hospitals, 1 is run by Planned Parenthood, 8 are run by community health centers and 22 are run by other types of agencies.
- Together, these clinics serve 50,920 women, including 8,650 teenagers.* 0% are served by health departments, 21% are served by hospitals, 24% are served by Planned Parenthood, 14% are served by community health centers and 41% are served by other types of agencies.

The Key Role of Title X

- 28 of the family planning clinics in Massachusetts's 8th congressional district are supported by Title X. 0 are run by health departments, 3 are run by hospitals, 0 are run by Planned Parenthood, 7 are run by community health centers and 18 are served by other types of agencies.
- These Title X-supported clinics in Massachusetts's 8th congressional district serve 26,160 women, including 4,700 teenagers.* 0% are served by health departments, 17% are served by hospitals, 0% are served by Planned Parenthood, 26% are served by community health centers and 57% are served by other types of agencies.

** These women may or may not live in 8th congressional district.*
