

Massachusetts: District 9

The Need for Services

- 25,520 women in need of publicly supported contraceptive services and supplies live in Massachusetts's 9th congressional district.

Meeting the Need

- There are 6 family planning clinics in Massachusetts's 9th congressional district. 0 are run by health departments, 0 are run by hospitals, 0 are run by Planned Parenthood, 4 are run by community health centers and 2 are run by other types of agencies.
- Together, these clinics serve 6,360 women, including 1,550 teenagers.* 0% are served by health departments, 0% are served by hospitals, 0% are served by Planned Parenthood, 50% are served by community health centers and 50% are served by other types of agencies.

The Key Role of Title X

- 5 of the family planning clinics in Massachusetts's 9th congressional district are supported by Title X. 0 are run by health departments, 0 are run by hospitals, 0 are run by Planned Parenthood, 3 are run by community health centers and 2 are served by other types of agencies.
- These Title X-supported clinics in Massachusetts's 9th congressional district serve 5,760 women, including 1,400 teenagers.* 0% are served by health departments, 0% are served by hospitals, 0% are served by Planned Parenthood, 45% are served by community health centers and 55% are served by other types of agencies.

** These women may or may not live in 9th congressional district.*
