

Minnesota: District 8

The Need for Services

- 38,270 women in need of publicly supported contraceptive services and supplies live in Minnesota's 8th congressional district.

Meeting the Need

- There are 42 family planning clinics in Minnesota's 8th congressional district. 2 are run by health departments, 2 are run by hospitals, 5 are run by Planned Parenthood, 5 are run by community health centers and 28 are run by other types of agencies.
- Together, these clinics serve 15,370 women, including 6,860 teenagers.* 1% are served by health departments, 11% are served by hospitals, 52% are served by Planned Parenthood, 4% are served by community health centers and 31% are served by other types of agencies.

The Key Role of Title X

- 7 of the family planning clinics in Minnesota's 8th congressional district are supported by Title X. 0 are run by health departments, 0 are run by hospitals, 5 are run by Planned Parenthood, 0 are run by community health centers and 2 are served by other types of agencies.
- These Title X-supported clinics in Minnesota's 8th congressional district serve 8,180 women, including 4,000 teenagers.* 0% are served by health departments, 0% are served by hospitals, 98% are served by Planned Parenthood, 0% are served by community health centers and 2% are served by other types of agencies.

** These women may or may not live in 8th congressional district.*
