

North Carolina: District 8

The Need for Services

- 35,820 women in need of publicly supported contraceptive services and supplies live in North Carolina's 8th congressional district.

Meeting the Need

- There are 12 family planning clinics in North Carolina's 8th congressional district. 9 are run by health departments, 0 are run by hospitals, 1 is run by Planned Parenthood, 2 are run by community health centers and 0 are run by other types of agencies.
- Together, these clinics serve 18,120 women, including 4,980 teenagers.* 67% are served by health departments, 0% are served by hospitals, 15% are served by Planned Parenthood, 18% are served by community health centers and 0% are served by other types of agencies.

The Key Role of Title X

- 9 of the family planning clinics in North Carolina's 8th congressional district are supported by Title X. 9 are run by health departments, 0 are run by hospitals, 0 are run by Planned Parenthood, 0 are run by community health centers and 0 are served by other types of agencies.
- These Title X-supported clinics in North Carolina's 8th congressional district serve 12,120 women, including 3,310 teenagers.* 100% are served by health departments, 0% are served by hospitals, 0% are served by Planned Parenthood, 0% are served by community health centers and 0% are served by other types of agencies.

** These women may or may not live in 8th congressional district.*
