

Oklahoma: District 1

The Need for Services

- 34,560 women in need of publicly supported contraceptive services and supplies live in Oklahoma's 1st congressional district.

Meeting the Need

- There are 13 family planning clinics in Oklahoma's 1st congressional district. 6 are run by health departments, 0 are run by hospitals, 3 are run by Planned Parenthood, 1 is run by a community health center and 3 are run by other types of agencies.
- Together, these clinics serve 12,470 women, including 3,570 teenagers.* 36% are served by health departments, 0% are served by hospitals, 41% are served by Planned Parenthood, 3% are served by community health centers and 20% are served by other types of agencies.

The Key Role of Title X

- 9 of the family planning clinics in Oklahoma's 1st congressional district are supported by Title X. 6 are run by health departments, 0 are run by hospitals, 2 are run by Planned Parenthood, 0 are run by community health centers and 1 is served by an other type of agency.
- These Title X-supported clinics in Oklahoma's 1st congressional district serve 10,760 women, including 3,050 teenagers.* 42% are served by health departments, 0% are served by hospitals, 38% are served by Planned Parenthood, 0% are served by community health centers and 20% are served by other types of agencies.

** These women may or may not live in 1st congressional district.*
