

Oklahoma: District 4

The Need for Services

- 40,080 women in need of publicly supported contraceptive services and supplies live in Oklahoma's 4th congressional district.

Meeting the Need

- There are 26 family planning clinics in Oklahoma's 4th congressional district. 19 are run by health departments, 0 are run by hospitals, 2 are run by Planned Parenthood, 1 is run by a community health center and 4 are run by other types of agencies.
- Together, these clinics serve 23,000 women, including 7,030 teenagers.* 66% are served by health departments, 0% are served by hospitals, 8% are served by Planned Parenthood, 17% are served by community health centers and 9% are served by other types of agencies.

The Key Role of Title X

- 19 of the family planning clinics in Oklahoma's 4th congressional district are supported by Title X. 19 are run by health departments, 0 are run by hospitals, 0 are run by Planned Parenthood, 0 are run by community health centers and 0 are served by other types of agencies.
- These Title X-supported clinics in Oklahoma's 4th congressional district serve 15,060 women, including 5,200 teenagers.* 100% are served by health departments, 0% are served by hospitals, 0% are served by Planned Parenthood, 0% are served by community health centers and 0% are served by other types of agencies.

** These women may or may not live in 4th congressional district.*
