

Oklahoma: District 5

The Need for Services

- 49,660 women in need of publicly supported contraceptive services and supplies live in Oklahoma's 5th congressional district.

Meeting the Need

- There are 22 family planning clinics in Oklahoma's 5th congressional district. 5 are run by health departments, 4 are run by hospitals, 3 are run by Planned Parenthood, 2 are run by community health centers and 8 are run by other types of agencies.
- Together, these clinics serve 17,050 women, including 4,260 teenagers.* 24% are served by health departments, 15% are served by hospitals, 36% are served by Planned Parenthood, 3% are served by community health centers and 22% are served by other types of agencies.

The Key Role of Title X

- 10 of the family planning clinics in Oklahoma's 5th congressional district are supported by Title X. 5 are run by health departments, 0 are run by hospitals, 0 are run by Planned Parenthood, 1 is run by a community health center and 4 are served by other types of agencies.
- These Title X-supported clinics in Oklahoma's 5th congressional district serve 6,780 women, including 1,660 teenagers.* 59% are served by health departments, 0% are served by hospitals, 0% are served by Planned Parenthood, 1% are served by community health centers and 40% are served by other types of agencies.

** These women may or may not live in 5th congressional district.*
