

South Dakota: at-large

The Need for Services

- 47,370 women in need of publicly supported contraceptive services and supplies live in South Dakota's at-large congressional district.

Meeting the Need

- There are 69 family planning clinics in South Dakota's at-large congressional district. 27 are run by health departments, 3 are run by hospitals, 2 are run by Planned Parenthood, 11 are run by community health centers and 26 are run by other types of agencies.
- Together, these clinics serve 22,950 women, including 6,990 teenagers.* 19% are served by health departments, 1% are served by hospitals, 9% are served by Planned Parenthood, 17% are served by community health centers and 54% are served by other types of agencies.

The Key Role of Title X

- 45 of the family planning clinics in South Dakota's at-large congressional district are supported by Title X. 26 are run by health departments, 3 are run by hospitals, 0 are run by Planned Parenthood, 5 are run by community health centers and 11 are served by other types of agencies.
- These Title X-supported clinics in South Dakota's at-large congressional district serve 15,970 women, including 5,060 teenagers.* 27% are served by health departments, 1% are served by hospitals, 0% are served by Planned Parenthood, 20% are served by community health centers and 52% are served by other types of agencies.

** These women may or may not live in at-large congressional district.*
