

Tennessee: District 9

The Need for Services

- 55,300 women in need of publicly supported contraceptive services and supplies live in Tennessee's 9th congressional district.

Meeting the Need

- There are 14 family planning clinics in Tennessee's 9th congressional district. 8 are run by health departments, 1 is run by a hospital, 1 is run by Planned Parenthood, 2 are run by community health centers and 2 are run by other types of agencies.
- Together, these clinics serve 14,680 women, including 4,570 teenagers.* 42% are served by health departments, 7% are served by hospitals, 38% are served by Planned Parenthood, 6% are served by community health centers and 8% are served by other types of agencies.

The Key Role of Title X

- 11 of the family planning clinics in Tennessee's 9th congressional district are supported by Title X. 8 are run by health departments, 0 are run by hospitals, 1 is run by Planned Parenthood, 2 are run by community health centers and 0 are served by other types of agencies.
- These Title X-supported clinics in Tennessee's 9th congressional district serve 12,510 women, including 3,830 teenagers.* 49% are served by health departments, 0% are served by hospitals, 44% are served by Planned Parenthood, 6% are served by community health centers and 0% are served by other types of agencies.

** These women may or may not live in 9th congressional district.*
