

Texas: District 10

The Need for Services

- 48,430 women in need of publicly supported contraceptive services and supplies live in Texas's 10th congressional district.

Meeting the Need

- There are 14 family planning clinics in Texas's 10th congressional district. 7 are run by health departments, 0 are run by hospitals, 3 are run by Planned Parenthood, 0 are run by community health centers and 4 are run by other types of agencies.
- Together, these clinics serve 24,140 women, including 6,620 teenagers.* 23% are served by health departments, 0% are served by hospitals, 57% are served by Planned Parenthood, 0% are served by community health centers and 20% are served by other types of agencies.

The Key Role of Title X

- 10 of the family planning clinics in Texas's 10th congressional district are supported by Title X. 7 are run by health departments, 0 are run by hospitals, 1 is run by Planned Parenthood, 0 are run by community health centers and 2 are served by other types of agencies.
- These Title X-supported clinics in Texas's 10th congressional district serve 15,720 women, including 3,840 teenagers.* 35% are served by health departments, 0% are served by hospitals, 38% are served by Planned Parenthood, 0% are served by community health centers and 27% are served by other types of agencies.

** These women may or may not live in 10th congressional district.*
