

Texas: District 13

The Need for Services

- 36,130 women in need of publicly supported contraceptive services and supplies live in Texas's 13th congressional district.

Meeting the Need

- There are 28 family planning clinics in Texas's 13th congressional district. 2 are run by health departments, 4 are run by hospitals, 14 are run by Planned Parenthood, 4 are run by community health centers and 4 are run by other types of agencies.
- Together, these clinics serve 18,540 women, including 5,320 teenagers.* 2% are served by health departments, 14% are served by hospitals, 56% are served by Planned Parenthood, 1% are served by community health centers and 27% are served by other types of agencies.

The Key Role of Title X

- 13 of the family planning clinics in Texas's 13th congressional district are supported by Title X. 0 are run by health departments, 0 are run by hospitals, 11 are run by Planned Parenthood, 0 are run by community health centers and 2 are served by other types of agencies.
- These Title X-supported clinics in Texas's 13th congressional district serve 14,050 women, including 4,080 teenagers.* 0% are served by health departments, 0% are served by hospitals, 65% are served by Planned Parenthood, 0% are served by community health centers and 35% are served by other types of agencies.

** These women may or may not live in 13th congressional district.*
