

Texas: District 14

The Need for Services

- 37,840 women in need of publicly supported contraceptive services and supplies live in Texas's 14th congressional district.

Meeting the Need

- There are 22 family planning clinics in Texas's 14th congressional district. 6 are run by health departments, 6 are run by hospitals, 0 are run by Planned Parenthood, 2 are run by community health centers and 8 are run by other types of agencies.
- Together, these clinics serve 19,230 women, including 4,180 teenagers.* 6% are served by health departments, 30% are served by hospitals, 0% are served by Planned Parenthood, 4% are served by community health centers and 61% are served by other types of agencies.

The Key Role of Title X

- 12 of the family planning clinics in Texas's 14th congressional district are supported by Title X. 0 are run by health departments, 5 are run by hospitals, 0 are run by Planned Parenthood, 0 are run by community health centers and 7 are served by other types of agencies.
- These Title X-supported clinics in Texas's 14th congressional district serve 12,460 women, including 2,820 teenagers.* 0% are served by health departments, 45% are served by hospitals, 0% are served by Planned Parenthood, 0% are served by community health centers and 55% are served by other types of agencies.

** These women may or may not live in 14th congressional district.*
