

Texas: District 16

The Need for Services

- 62,260 women in need of publicly supported contraceptive services and supplies live in Texas's 16th congressional district.

Meeting the Need

- There are 21 family planning clinics in Texas's 16th congressional district. 1 is run by a health department, 11 are run by hospitals, 3 are run by Planned Parenthood, 5 are run by community health centers and 1 is run by an other type of agency.
- Together, these clinics serve 30,140 women, including 5,500 teenagers.* 1% are served by health departments, 48% are served by hospitals, 46% are served by Planned Parenthood, 6% are served by community health centers and 0% are served by other types of agencies.

The Key Role of Title X

- 12 of the family planning clinics in Texas's 16th congressional district are supported by Title X. 0 are run by health departments, 11 are run by hospitals, 1 is run by Planned Parenthood, 0 are run by community health centers and 0 are served by other types of agencies.
- These Title X-supported clinics in Texas's 16th congressional district serve 21,200 women, including 3,420 teenagers.* 0% are served by health departments, 68% are served by hospitals, 32% are served by Planned Parenthood, 0% are served by community health centers and 0% are served by other types of agencies.

** These women may or may not live in 16th congressional district.*
