



Texas: District 19

The Need for Services

- 47,840 women in need of publicly supported contraceptive services and supplies live in Texas's 19th congressional district.

Meeting the Need

- There are 26 family planning clinics in Texas's 19th congressional district. 6 are run by health departments, 0 are run by hospitals, 3 are run by Planned Parenthood, 4 are run by community health centers and 13 are run by other types of agencies.
- Together, these clinics serve 18,250 women, including 6,380 teenagers.* 8% are served by health departments, 0% are served by hospitals, 56% are served by Planned Parenthood, 9% are served by community health centers and 28% are served by other types of agencies.

The Key Role of Title X

- 6 of the family planning clinics in Texas's 19th congressional district are supported by Title X. 1 is run by a health department, 0 are run by hospitals, 1 is run by Planned Parenthood, 0 are run by community health centers and 4 are served by other types of agencies.
- These Title X-supported clinics in Texas's 19th congressional district serve 6,800 women, including 2,700 teenagers.* 9% are served by health departments, 0% are served by hospitals, 68% are served by Planned Parenthood, 0% are served by community health centers and 23% are served by other types of agencies.

** These women may or may not live in 19th congressional district.*
