



Texas: District 21

The Need for Services

- 18,130 women in need of publicly supported contraceptive services and supplies live in Texas's 21th congressional district.

Meeting the Need

- There are 8 family planning clinics in Texas's 21th congressional district. 3 are run by health departments, 0 are run by hospitals, 0 are run by Planned Parenthood, 0 are run by community health centers and 5 are run by other types of agencies.
- Together, these clinics serve 3,570 women, including 770 teenagers.* 11% are served by health departments, 0% are served by hospitals, 0% are served by Planned Parenthood, 0% are served by community health centers and 89% are served by other types of agencies.

The Key Role of Title X

- 7 of the family planning clinics in Texas's 21th congressional district are supported by Title X. 2 are run by health departments, 0 are run by hospitals, 0 are run by Planned Parenthood, 0 are run by community health centers and 5 are served by other types of agencies.
- These Title X-supported clinics in Texas's 21th congressional district serve 3,360 women, including 730 teenagers.* 5% are served by health departments, 0% are served by hospitals, 0% are served by Planned Parenthood, 0% are served by community health centers and 95% are served by other types of agencies.

** These women may or may not live in 21th congressional district.*
