

Texas: District 23

The Need for Services

- 55,270 women in need of publicly supported contraceptive services and supplies live in Texas's 23th congressional district.

Meeting the Need

- There are 37 family planning clinics in Texas's 23th congressional district. 12 are run by health departments, 4 are run by hospitals, 0 are run by Planned Parenthood, 9 are run by community health centers and 12 are run by other types of agencies.
- Together, these clinics serve 15,590 women, including 2,680 teenagers.* 20% are served by health departments, 13% are served by hospitals, 0% are served by Planned Parenthood, 20% are served by community health centers and 47% are served by other types of agencies.

The Key Role of Title X

- 13 of the family planning clinics in Texas's 23th congressional district are supported by Title X. 0 are run by health departments, 2 are run by hospitals, 0 are run by Planned Parenthood, 3 are run by community health centers and 8 are served by other types of agencies.
- These Title X-supported clinics in Texas's 23th congressional district serve 7,270 women, including 1,230 teenagers.* 0% are served by health departments, 1% are served by hospitals, 0% are served by Planned Parenthood, 16% are served by community health centers and 83% are served by other types of agencies.

** These women may or may not live in 23th congressional district.*
