

Texas: District 26

The Need for Services

- 19,180 women in need of publicly supported contraceptive services and supplies live in Texas's 26th congressional district.

Meeting the Need

- There are 5 family planning clinics in Texas's 26th congressional district. 0 are run by health departments, 1 is run by a hospital, 3 are run by Planned Parenthood, 0 are run by community health centers and 1 is run by an other type of agency.
- Together, these clinics serve 11,970 women, including 3,980 teenagers.* 0% are served by health departments, 9% are served by hospitals, 67% are served by Planned Parenthood, 0% are served by community health centers and 24% are served by other types of agencies.

The Key Role of Title X

- 3 of the family planning clinics in Texas's 26th congressional district are supported by Title X. 0 are run by health departments, 0 are run by hospitals, 2 are run by Planned Parenthood, 0 are run by community health centers and 1 is served by an other type of agency.
- These Title X-supported clinics in Texas's 26th congressional district serve 7,610 women, including 2,260 teenagers.* 0% are served by health departments, 0% are served by hospitals, 62% are served by Planned Parenthood, 0% are served by community health centers and 38% are served by other types of agencies.

** These women may or may not live in 26th congressional district.*
