

Texas: District 8

The Need for Services

- 18,920 women in need of publicly supported contraceptive services and supplies live in Texas's 8th congressional district.

Meeting the Need

- There are 4 family planning clinics in Texas's 8th congressional district. 1 is run by a health department, 2 are run by hospitals, 0 are run by Planned Parenthood, 0 are run by community health centers and 1 is run by an other type of agency.
- Together, these clinics serve 4,780 women, including 1,000 teenagers.* 24% are served by health departments, 64% are served by hospitals, 0% are served by Planned Parenthood, 0% are served by community health centers and 12% are served by other types of agencies.

The Key Role of Title X

- 3 of the family planning clinics in Texas's 8th congressional district are supported by Title X. 1 is run by a health department, 2 are run by hospitals, 0 are run by Planned Parenthood, 0 are run by community health centers and 0 are served by other types of agencies.
- These Title X-supported clinics in Texas's 8th congressional district serve 4,220 women, including 800 teenagers.* 27% are served by health departments, 73% are served by hospitals, 0% are served by Planned Parenthood, 0% are served by community health centers and 0% are served by other types of agencies.

** These women may or may not live in 8th congressional district.*
