



Vermont: at-large

The Need for Services

- 37,550 women in need of publicly supported contraceptive services and supplies live in Vermont's at-large congressional district.

Meeting the Need

- There are 19 family planning clinics in Vermont's at-large congressional district. 0 are run by health departments, 1 is run by a hospital, 13 are run by Planned Parenthood, 5 are run by community health centers and 0 are run by other types of agencies.
- Together, these clinics serve 20,620 women, including 6,400 teenagers.* 0% are served by health departments, 1% are served by hospitals, 97% are served by Planned Parenthood, 2% are served by community health centers and 0% are served by other types of agencies.

The Key Role of Title X

- 10 of the family planning clinics in Vermont's at-large congressional district are supported by Title X. 0 are run by health departments, 0 are run by hospitals, 10 are run by Planned Parenthood, 0 are run by community health centers and 0 are served by other types of agencies.
- These Title X-supported clinics in Vermont's at-large congressional district serve 10,510 women, including 3,300 teenagers.* 0% are served by health departments, 0% are served by hospitals, 100% are served by Planned Parenthood, 0% are served by community health centers and 0% are served by other types of agencies.

** These women may or may not live in at-large congressional district.*
