



Virginia: District 1

The Need for Services

- 22,980 women in need of publicly supported contraceptive services and supplies live in Virginia's 1st congressional district.

Meeting the Need

- There are 20 family planning clinics in Virginia's 1st congressional district. 16 are run by health departments, 0 are run by hospitals, 1 is run by Planned Parenthood, 2 are run by community health centers and 1 is run by an other type of agency.
- Together, these clinics serve 5,780 women, including 2,250 teenagers.* 85% are served by health departments, 0% are served by hospitals, 10% are served by Planned Parenthood, 5% are served by community health centers and 0% are served by other types of agencies.

The Key Role of Title X

- 17 of the family planning clinics in Virginia's 1st congressional district are supported by Title X. 16 are run by health departments, 0 are run by hospitals, 0 are run by Planned Parenthood, 0 are run by community health centers and 1 is served by an other type of agency.
- These Title X-supported clinics in Virginia's 1st congressional district serve 4,900 women, including 1,780 teenagers.* 100% are served by health departments, 0% are served by hospitals, 0% are served by Planned Parenthood, 0% are served by community health centers and 0% are served by other types of agencies.

** These women may or may not live in 1st congressional district.*
