



Washington: District 1

The Need for Services

- 19,450 women in need of publicly supported contraceptive services and supplies live in Washington's 1st congressional district.

Meeting the Need

- There are 12 family planning clinics in Washington's 1st congressional district. 3 are run by health departments, 0 are run by hospitals, 2 are run by Planned Parenthood, 6 are run by community health centers and 1 is run by an other type of agency.
- Together, these clinics serve 10,720 women, including 3,800 teenagers.* 16% are served by health departments, 0% are served by hospitals, 72% are served by Planned Parenthood, 12% are served by community health centers and 1% are served by other types of agencies.

The Key Role of Title X

- 5 of the family planning clinics in Washington's 1st congressional district are supported by Title X. 3 are run by health departments, 0 are run by hospitals, 2 are run by Planned Parenthood, 0 are run by community health centers and 0 are served by other types of agencies.
- These Title X-supported clinics in Washington's 1st congressional district serve 9,390 women, including 3,570 teenagers.* 18% are served by health departments, 0% are served by hospitals, 82% are served by Planned Parenthood, 0% are served by community health centers and 0% are served by other types of agencies.

** These women may or may not live in 1st congressional district.*
