

Washington: District 5

The Need for Services

- 48,450 women in need of publicly supported contraceptive services and supplies live in Washington's 5th congressional district.

Meeting the Need

- There are 26 family planning clinics in Washington's 5th congressional district. 3 are run by health departments, 3 are run by hospitals, 5 are run by Planned Parenthood, 11 are run by community health centers and 4 are run by other types of agencies.
- Together, these clinics serve 20,220 women, including 7,300 teenagers.* 4% are served by health departments, 1% are served by hospitals, 79% are served by Planned Parenthood, 7% are served by community health centers and 8% are served by other types of agencies.

The Key Role of Title X

- 11 of the family planning clinics in Washington's 5th congressional district are supported by Title X. 3 are run by health departments, 0 are run by hospitals, 5 are run by Planned Parenthood, 2 are run by community health centers and 1 is served by an other type of agency.
- These Title X-supported clinics in Washington's 5th congressional district serve 18,250 women, including 6,780 teenagers.* 5% are served by health departments, 0% are served by hospitals, 87% are served by Planned Parenthood, 0% are served by community health centers and 8% are served by other types of agencies.

** These women may or may not live in 5th congressional district.*
