

## Washington: District 7

### The Need for Services

- 39,060 women in need of publicly supported contraceptive services and supplies live in Washington's 7th congressional district.

### Meeting the Need

- There are 25 family planning clinics in Washington's 7th congressional district. 4 are run by health departments, 5 are run by hospitals, 2 are run by Planned Parenthood, 13 are run by community health centers and 1 is run by an other type of agency.
- Together, these clinics serve 32,650 women, including 7,740 teenagers.\* 14% are served by health departments, 18% are served by hospitals, 38% are served by Planned Parenthood, 26% are served by community health centers and 4% are served by other types of agencies.

### The Key Role of Title X

- 7 of the family planning clinics in Washington's 7th congressional district are supported by Title X. 4 are run by health departments, 0 are run by hospitals, 1 is run by Planned Parenthood, 2 are run by community health centers and 0 are served by other types of agencies.
- These Title X-supported clinics in Washington's 7th congressional district serve 11,390 women, including 3,230 teenagers.\* 40% are served by health departments, 0% are served by hospitals, 52% are served by Planned Parenthood, 8% are served by community health centers and 0% are served by other types of agencies.

*\* These women may or may not live in 7th congressional district.*
