

West Virginia: District 1

The Need for Services

- 36,740 women in need of publicly supported contraceptive services and supplies live in West Virginia's 1st congressional district.

Meeting the Need

- There are 45 family planning clinics in West Virginia's 1st congressional district. 18 are run by health departments, 5 are run by hospitals, 1 is run by Planned Parenthood, 12 are run by community health centers and 9 are run by other types of agencies.
- Together, these clinics serve 16,560 women, including 4,380 teenagers.* 69% are served by health departments, 7% are served by hospitals, 7% are served by Planned Parenthood, 8% are served by community health centers and 9% are served by other types of agencies.

The Key Role of Title X

- 36 of the family planning clinics in West Virginia's 1st congressional district are supported by Title X. 18 are run by health departments, 5 are run by hospitals, 0 are run by Planned Parenthood, 5 are run by community health centers and 8 are served by other types of agencies.
- These Title X-supported clinics in West Virginia's 1st congressional district serve 14,230 women, including 3,860 teenagers.* 80% are served by health departments, 9% are served by hospitals, 0% are served by Planned Parenthood, 2% are served by community health centers and 10% are served by other types of agencies.

** These women may or may not live in 1st congressional district.*
