

Wisconsin: District 8

The Need for Services

- 25,190 women in need of publicly supported contraceptive services and supplies live in Wisconsin's 8th congressional district.

Meeting the Need

- There are 20 family planning clinics in Wisconsin's 8th congressional district. 1 is run by a health department, 0 are run by hospitals, 4 are run by Planned Parenthood, 2 are run by community health centers and 13 are run by other types of agencies.
- Together, these clinics serve 11,550 women, including 3,020 teenagers.* 1% are served by health departments, 0% are served by hospitals, 66% are served by Planned Parenthood, 2% are served by community health centers and 31% are served by other types of agencies.

The Key Role of Title X

- 1 of the family planning clinics in 8th congressional district is supported by Title X. 0 are run by health departments, 0 are run by hospitals, 0 are run by Planned Parenthood, 0 are run by community health centers and 1 is served by an other type of agency.
- These Title X-supported clinics in Wisconsin's 8th congressional district serve 1,290 women, including not available teenagers.* 0% are served by health departments, 0% are served by hospitals, 0% are served by Planned Parenthood, 0% are served by community health centers and 100% are served by other types of agencies.

** These women may or may not live in 8th congressional district.*
